



Rehabilitative & Community Support Services

Once a child is determined eligible for **Section 28** services by CBHS (Children Behavioral Health Services) due to cognitive impairments or functional limitations, one of our supervisors will complete an assessment with the family and client. The team will then create a treatment plan based on the identified needs of the client and family. With each treatment plan, we focus on improving the child's daily living, socialization, communication and behavioral management skills. A Behavioral Health Professional will work with the child at home and within the community. Our ultimate objective is to provide tools to the child and family to help them be successful and independent in their home and natural environment.

Children's Behavioral Health

We provide services to children under **65 HCT** with a mental health diagnosis who are at risk of out-of-home placement. A licensed clinician completes an assessment and then works with the family to develop a treatment plan. The clinician provides strategies in order to help manage the child's behavior. Our team focuses on identifying client and family's strengths and builds on those strengths to better manage the identified challenges.

In addition, a certified Behavioral Health Professional meets with the family to support the achievement of goals within a 90 to 180 day period where active participation by the guardian is required. The goal is to help educate families about their child's strengths and challenges. We teach families how to respond to their child's challenges and promote positive growth that will last long after our services end.

HCT is a self-referral service. Families, Case Managers, Doctors, etc. may contact MAS Home Care of Maine to receive services.



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
